Were any topics on the agenda relevant to any LWV state or local positions or programs? Rocky and Shealy Langley (334.444.6255; <u>shealy.langley@gmail.com</u>; https://www.wrbl.com/news/local-news/opelika-creekline-) presented *Opelika's Greenway along the Blueway – The Creekline project* at the Commissions' Work Session. The Project is intended to complement Auburn's *Saugahatchee – Creek Blueway Project*, of which Phase I has been approved for construction under the Department of Parks and Recreation. Auburn's project extends roughly from the Saugahatchee Creek at North Donahue to Richland Road. Langlely's project would tie into Auburn's, and expand well beyond that. Both projects will involve canoeing, pedestrian trails, bicycle paths, among other opportunities. In short, both projects will provide multiple recreation opportunities for people of all ages and physical capabilities. This is the first presentation made to the City Council by the Langleys. Although no action was taken by the Opelika Commission, several commissioners expressed support for the project and encouraged them to pursue it. It represents two citizens independently striving to present new recreational and economic development opportunities to the citizens of Opelika and its environs.

**Do you recommend local League action on any of these issues?** Yes. Langley's project is in its infancy. LWV should research the Langley's project and evaluate its merits in improving the quality of life of its citizens and contributing to the economic development of the region. If the project is found viable, LWV members may help promote the project by assisting in networking the Langleys with others with common interest, including AU, consultants, among others.
