- 2. **Opelika-Auburn News Reporter**: Timothy Noordermeer; (334.707.0955); <u>thoordermeer@oanow.com</u>
- Roundabout: Council endorsed ALDOT's proposal to construct roundabout at intersection of North College Street and Farmville Roads, including City's request to change speed from 55 to 45 m.p.h. ALDOT to fund the project.
- 4. **Diversity and Inclusion Task Force**: In formative stage. Contact Councilors Fitch-Taylor and Dixon if interested in serving.
- 5. **Gentrification:** During the Citizen's Open Forum concern was expressed over the apparent gentrification of NW Auburn or segments thereof. Select Councilors commented that property owners have a right to sell their homes or business as they may determine to be in their best interest. *Caveat Emptor.* Others commented that an assumption often made is that seller has full knowledge of the terms conditions of the transaction, which may or may not always hold. Suggestions were made that the *Auburn Family* consists of people of all ages, education levels and incomes, and that to remain the *Loveliest Village on the Plains*, Auburn must have a social conscious that addresses the needs of all its people and as was intimated Auburn is only as good as it addresses the needs, hopes, and aspirations of those that have the least.

5. **Short Term Rentals Task Force**: Task Force continues to meet; it has received considerable comments and is analyzing same. Task Force Is considering expanding membership to broaden participation. Contact Councilors Smith and Parsons if interested in serving.

Mayor Anders commented that over the past several years there's been considerable discussion by and among the public and Councilors regarding short term rentals with no action taken. Upon being elected Mayor Anders elected to formalize the debate through the formation of the Task Force with the hope of building a community-wide consensus by formalizing polic(ies) associated therewith. There appears to be strong arguments (and feelings) on both sides of the subject, with a portion of the population feeling that the rentals should be allowed community wide; others argue for limiting them to designated areas or zoning districts. Enforceability of any policy seems, at best, challenging from both a location and taxing perspective.

- School Board Appointment: Deadline for submitting application is February 4th at 5:00 p.m. CST. Interviews are scheduled to commence Tuesday, February 12th. If necessary, interviews will be extended to Wednesday, February 13th.
- 7. **General Observation of the Meeting:** It is worth noting that, in the opinion of this Observer, Council meetings are being conducted with an unprecedented air of transparency with Councilors freely expressing their thoughts and opinions. Also, videos of meetings are timely posted on the City's websites/Facebook page(s); e.g., Tuesday's meeting (January 22nd) was available Wednesday morning, January 23rd. Furthermore, of import is the fact that the public is given three (3 opportunities to speak: first, during *Citizens' Communication* (Item # 6 on the Agenda); secondly, during *Public Hearings*; and, thirdly, *Citizens Open Forum* (last item on the Agenda).
