One may also see whether the League has a taken a position on a particular bill and all of the bills may be downloaded from this site.

The Legislative Forum as well as our various debates and programming are essential to the LWV mission. The nonpartisan aspect of the League positions us perfectly to bring together all citizens regardless of one's political leanings. All members of the community are encouraged to attend the forum. It is important that our elected officials know that citizens of Lee County are interested in what they have to say. I hope to see you there!
